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Directors' report for the year ended 31st December 2013

The directors present their annual report and the audited financial statements for the year ended 31st December 2013.

Principal activities, review of the activities and future developments

Kilminchy Management Company Limited, which is a company limited by guarantee and not having a share capital, is established for the purposes of taking ownership of and responsibility for managing and maintaining the development in Kilminchy, Portlaoise. Revenue is generated throught service fees charged to each residential owner. The fee is calculated on a flat fee basis agreed at the Annual General Meeting. The directors have no plans to make any significant changes to the business in the near future.

Results

The surplus for the year, after taxation, amounted to €102,603 (2012 - €10,532).

Research and development

The company did not have any research and development expenditure during the year.

Events since the balance sheet date

No events occured after the year ended 31st December 2013 that require changes to the accounts.
