Directors' report for the year ended 31 December 2014

The directors present their report and the audited financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2014.

Principal activities and review of the business

Kilminchy Management Company Limited, which is a company limited by guarantee and not having a share capital, is established for the purposes of taking ownership of and responsibility for managing and maintaining the development in Kilminchy, Portlaoise. Revenue is generated through service fees charged to each resedential owner. The fee is calculated on a flat fee basis agreed at the Annual General Meeting. The directors have no plans to make any significant changes to the business in the near future.

Research and development

The company did not have any research and development expenditure during the year.

Events since the balance sheet date

No events occured after the year end that require changes to the accounts.

Multi Unit Developments Act 2011

In compliance with the Multi-Unit Development Act 2011, the directors wish to make the following disclosures:

- 6. The directors have no plans to initiate expenditure on the refurbishment, improvement or maintenance of a non-recurring nature at present.
- 7. A statement fully disclosing any contracts entered into or in force between the company and a director or shadow director of the company or a person who is a connected person as respects that director or shadow director has been included in note of these financial statements.

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In accordance with the Articles of Association, all members of the board of directors shall retire by rotation and, being eligible, shall offer themselves for re-election.

Principal risks and uncertainties

The company is exposed to the prevailing economic conditions in Ireland and the principal risk affecting the company is liquidity risk pertaining to the collection of outstanding service charges.

Books of account

The measures taken by the directors to ensure compliance with the requirements of Section 202, Companies Act, 1990, regarding proper books of account are the implementation of necessary policies and procedures for recording transactions, the employment of competent accounting personnel with appropriate expertise and the provision of adequate resources to the financial function. The books of account of the company are maintained at the Registered Office.

Auditors

The auditor MK Brazil resigned as auditor during the year and the directors appointed Ronan Leech and Company to fill the vacancy.
